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Passover Lamb 14<sup>th</sup> 3pm \*About the ninth hour Jesus cried out with a loud voice, saying, "Eli, Eli, LAMA SABACHTHANI?" that is, "My God, My God, why have You forsaken Me? Math 27:46 (continued ...)

Jesus breathes His last and yields His spirit.

The veil of the temple is torn. An earthquake occurs and rocks are split.

The tombs are opened and many bodies of the saints are raised.

(the Lamb is observed for the 5<sup>th</sup> and final day)

\*And ye shall keep it up until the fourteenth day of the same month:

and the whole assembly of the congregation of Israel shall kill it "in the evening". Exo 12:6 The expression "in the evening" means when the shadows appear (3pm) but before sunset The Crucifixion, the death of Christ is at 3pm, the exact time the first Passover lamb is killed.

Jesus is our Passover Lamb. He takes away the sins of the world.

God "passes over" our sin death penalty when we believe in Jesus. He died for me.

Jesus is in the tomb/grave before 6 pm (or sunset).

Joseph of Arimathea takes Jesus body and wraps it in linen and places it in his own new tomb. A large stone is rolled against the entrance; the tomb is sealed and guarded by Roman soldiers.

Jesus is Sheol, Paradise section where He is greeted with excitement by the believers who have been resting on Abraham bosom. He is also probably greeted with shock and disappointment by the unbelievers who are in the Hades side of Sheol.

(as Thursday ends, Jesus has been in the grave one day ... or partial day from 3pm to sunset)

Passover Meal 15<sup>th</sup>

Friday begins at sunset (approximately 6 pm)

&

The Passover Seder meal is observed this evening.

Unleavened Bread

This begins the 7 days of Unleavened Bread Feast, which begins with the Passover Meal.

The 7 day feast commemorates when the Jews left Egypt.

(as Friday ends, Jesus has been in the grave two days and one night)

16<sup>th</sup> Saturday begins at sunset (approximately 6pm)

The Sabbath is observed, the Holy day of reading and worship in the Synagogues

(as Saturday ends, Jesus has been in the grave three days and two nights)

First Fruits

17<sup>th</sup> Sunday begins at sunset (approximately 6pm)

> From sunset until sunrise on Sunday, Jesus completes his third night in the grave Jesus has been in grave three days and three nights ... the sign of Jonah is fulfilled.

Christ arose after sunrise on Sunday, around 6 am! After sunrise Jesus is seen at the tomb by Mary.

Sometime after this Jesus ascends to the Father and leads the "captives" to heaven.

The captives are the Believers who are in Paradise and the walking resurrected

Jesus appears to the visitors on the road to Emmaus

Jesus returns to Jerusalem and is seen by all the Disciples except Thomas.
