These dates follow the Messianic Calendar put out by Lion and Lamb Ministries. Here is how the dates are calculated: The Gregorian calendar is overlaid by the Jewish Diaspora calendar and modified to incorporate God's appointed times as given by Moses and synchronized to start each Hebrew month on the new moon as it would be seen from the Temple Mount in Jerusalem. This new moon is calculated using lunar phase software that can pinpoint the moon's position and phase at any time from any latitude/longitude on earth. I echo the statement included in their calendar, "Our calendar is not perfect, but our hope is that all Messianic believers who use our calendar will learn to keep the Sabbaths and the feasts in the way that the Lord has impressed upon us individually."
